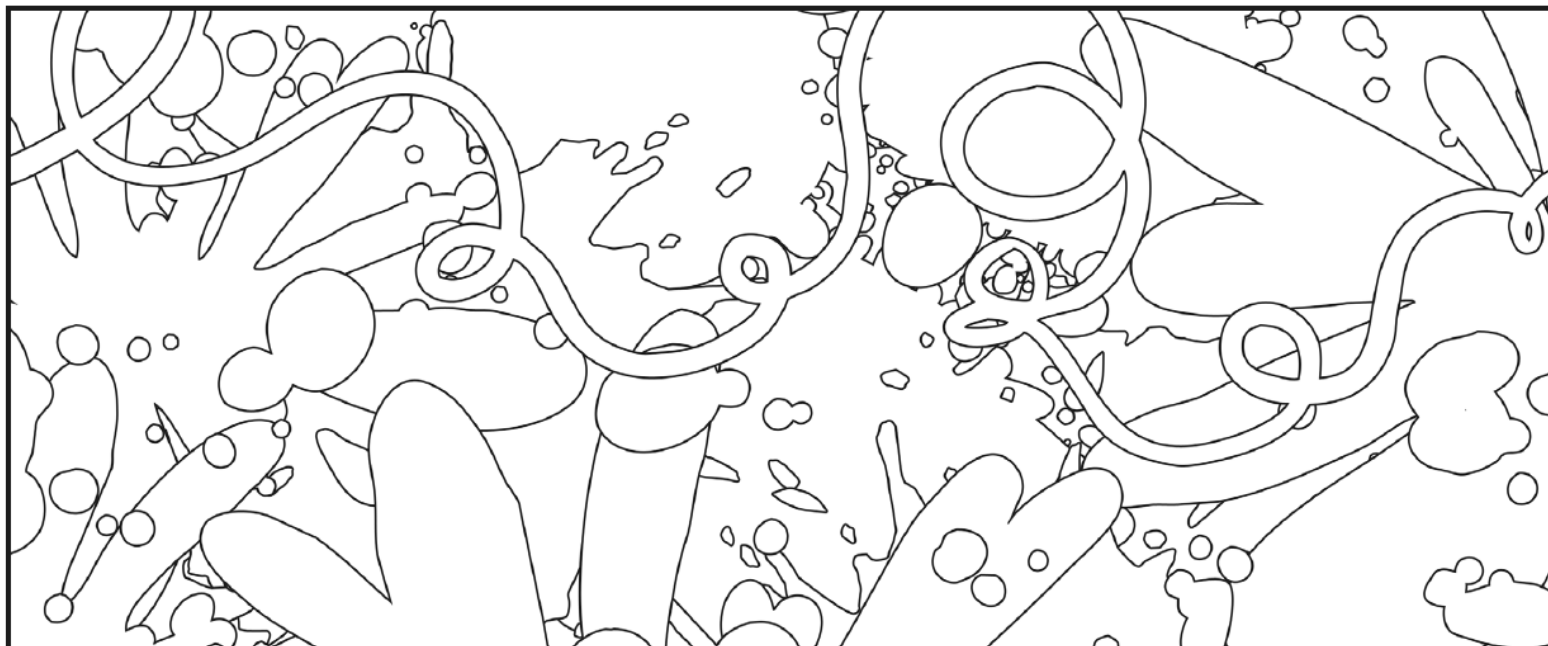


This is the one I did on my computer. (P1-7)
